

Elections:

Elections in Oklahoma are always held on Tuesdays. Elections for county, state, and federal offices are held in even-numbered years.

- Primary Elections are held on the last Tuesday in June.
- Runoff Primary Elections are held on the fourth Tuesday in August.
- General Elections are held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
- Presidential Preferential Primary Elections are held on the first Tuesday in March in presidential election years.

School districts hold elections for Board of Education offices every year on the second Tuesday in February. Runoff elections for Board of Education offices are held if needed on the first Tuesday in April. You may vote in a school district election only if you are registered and reside at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the school district.

Most regular municipal elections are held in odd-numbered years, usually in February and April. The dates may vary from one municipality to another. Exact dates may be obtained from municipal officials. You may vote in a municipal election only if you are registered and reside at an address located within the geographical boundaries of the municipality.

Closed Primary Elections:

Oklahoma has a closed primary system. If you register to vote in a political party, you may vote only for that party's candidates in party primary elections. If you do not register in a political party (by choosing the "no Party" option on the Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form), you may not vote in party primaries.
