REQUEST AN EMERGENCY BALLOT FOR THE March 5 ELECTION

Registered voters who become physically incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. Monday, February 19 and are unable make it to the polls, still have an opportunity to cast their ballot.

Blaine County Election Board Secretary Brenda Rice said that state law permits voters who become emergency incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. Monday, February 19 to vote under special provisions. Rice said emergency incapacitation is something most voters don't think about. "Voting is our constitutional right, but life happens. Injury, illness, or even childbirth can prevent a voter from being able to go to the polls. That's why it's important to make sure voters know their rights in the event of an emergency."

If you or someone you know becomes physically incapacitated after 5:00 p.m. February 19, contact your County Election Board as soon as possible. Rice said Election Board officials will work with you to make sure you have all of the necessary information to cast your ballot.
